Cognitive vs. Affective

- Richard Gombrich
 - → Cognitive: what we say/think we believe
 - → Affective: what our actions indicate we believe
 - → What is the **cognitive** belief of Timon and Pumbaa (and Simba)?
 - → What is the **affective** belief of Timon and Pumbaa (and Simba)?

Cognitive vs. Affective

- Analysis of Lion King:
 - → Timon, Pumbaa, and Simba say that they believe in "Hakuna Matata"
 - → Initially their behaviour also shows they believe in "Hakuna Matata"
 - → However when loved ones are in trouble their actions show that they DO believe they have responsibilities

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Cognitive vs. Affective

- Possible message:
 - → Having "no worries" can help us deal with bad experiences
 - → However in some situations we do need to live up to our responsibilities

- Cultural context of people's lives
 - I. Impact on our beliefs
 - → (Note: individual choice/agency)

Habitus

- Pierre Bourdieu and Catherine Bell
- Cultural context of people's lives
 - 2. How specific beliefs are viewed/practiced
 - → (e.g., belief in "sanctity of life")

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Habitus

- Analysis of Lion King:
 - → Impact of cultural context on Simba's beliefs?
 - ⇒ Simba is exposed to two cultures that teach two different belief systems
 - → Responsibility ("circle of life") vs "hakuna matata"
 - → What is the film trying to tell us?

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Reductionist

- Religion is "really" about something else (of THIS world)
- Usually a critique of religion
 - → Beliefs are false/meaningless
- Other (more positive) perspectives
 - → Afterlife stories (this week's reading)

Habitus

- Possible message:
 - ➡ It is better to live up to our responsibilities than to ignore problems

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Reductionist

- "humans make up images of god for human purposes"
 - → Xenophanes: horse gods look like horses
 - → Feuerbach: God is a projection
 - ⇒ Freud: father → God (comfort + protect)
 - → The Lion King?

Reductionist

- "humans make up images of god for human purposes"
 - → What is Simba's purpose?
 - → Relationship with his father
 - → Internal struggle: should he go back home and help?

Reductionist

- Possible messages:
 - → Belief in the supernatural can allow us to deal with feelings of loss
 - → We should live up to our responsibilities

Reductionist

- Religion is "really" about something else (of THIS world)
- "humans make up images of god for human purposes"
- Most films for RLG101H assignment will not have supernatural elements
- Possible to apply reductionist theory to other abstract concepts

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Reductionist

- Abstract concepts:
 - → Love, honour, tradition
 - → Often helpful to look at concepts used as reasons for doing something
- Lion King?
 - → "circle of life"
 - → "hakuna matata"

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
Non-Reductionist

- Assume beliefs point to reality or "essence"
- Different religions = different perceptions
 - ⇒ Blind men and the elephant
- Hick ("the Real"), Eliade ("the Sacred")
- The Lion King: Mufasa really does live in the sky
- Critiques: Gill, McCutcheon, Wiebe

Non-Reductionist

- "This uniqueness is what is referred to as the 'sui generis' approach, that religion is a distinct element of human activity, that can be explained in solely human terms." (p. 114)
- Error in quote: "can be explained" should be "can't be explained"

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"Common Sense"

- Leach, Malinowski, Geertz, Evans-Pritchard, Tonkinson (p. 119-123)
 - → Don't worry about this section
 - → Main point: "belief" is complicated!!

- Study of the brain
- Luther Martin ≠ Martin Luther!
- Non-reductionist (Whitehouse)
- Reductionist (Guthrie, Boyer)
